



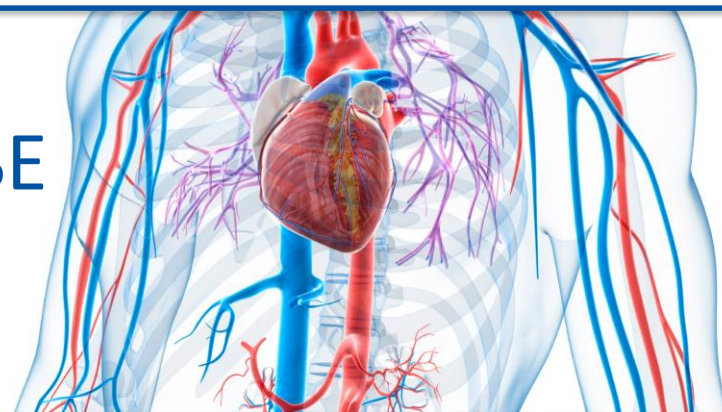

Benefits of Strong Partnership

- Better Instruction
- Continuity provides predictability
- Inter-rater reliability
- Timely feedback to correct issues
- Retention of clinical sites



Communication

- Define Program goals of the internship
 - Create entry level technologist
 - Create professional health care provider

EXAMPLE

Assuming "TIS" (technically ideal study)

Minimal preceptor guidance:

Normal Echo 40 min

Carotid 35 min

Indirect arterial studies (ABI/WBI) 20-30 min

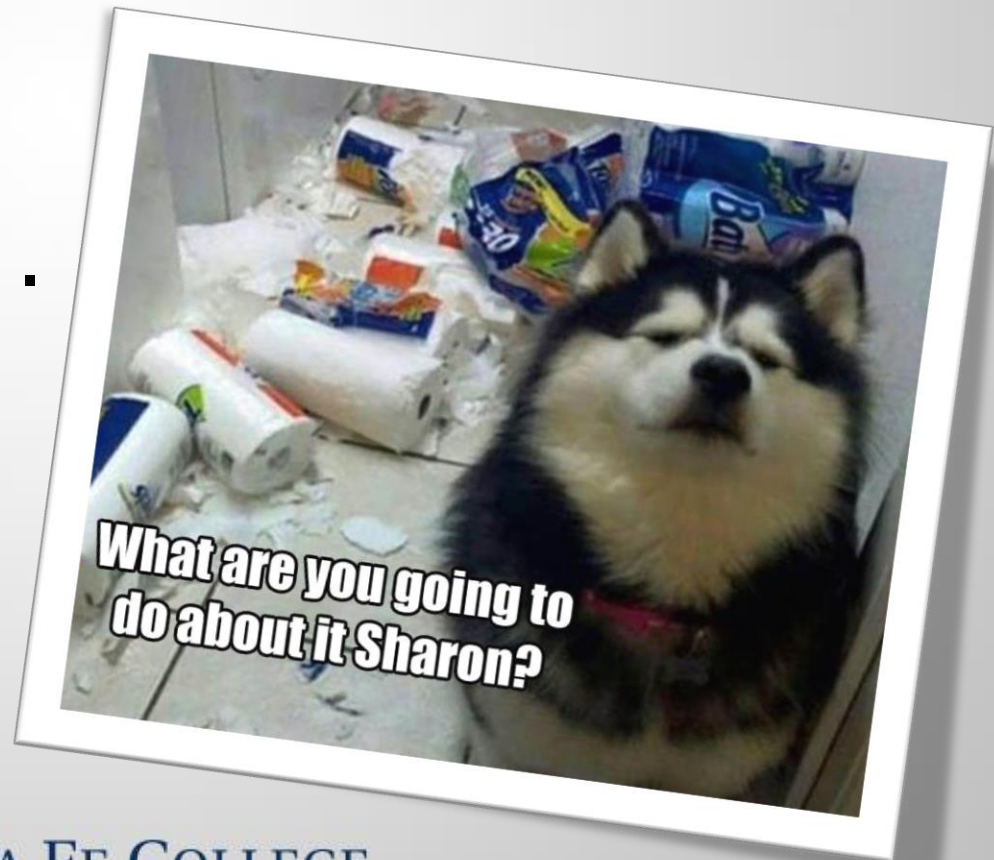
Communication

- Define expectations of all parties
 - Identify end goal of students
 - Identify unacceptable behaviors
 - Provide preceptors weekly goals for students customized to individual labs
 - Ask preceptors to create FAQ document
- Be flexible with communication mechanism

The Key is Communication

- Students call the lab before the first day of rotation.
- Students update info sheet for each lab.
- Students are responsible for weekly communication with faculty.
- Foster investment of Preceptors with CEUs.

What are your days/hours?	Tuesday through Friday (no exceptions) 8:30 – 5:00pm
Lab Manager's FULL Name	Carrie Crawford or Matt Allen
Lab Manager's Title	Carrie - Vascular Lead Tech; Matt – Non-Invasive Lab Director
Lab Manager's Phone Number	(352)-733-8329 – This is the vascular tech room phone number. You can ask for Carrie but, if she is not there, any of the vascular techs can give you instructions for your rotation. Just get the name of who you spoke to.
Do you have a set preceptor or do you rotate?	Rotate every day throughout the day; everyone hangs out in the tech reading room. When a tech goes to do a study students are expected to ask to go with them.
List different types of procedures this lab performs (RHC, LHC, Peripheral intervention/stents, Echo, Carotid, ABI, LEA, LEV, TEE, Stress Echo, etc)	Carotid, ABI/segmentals, ABI with or w/o exercise, WBI, LEA, Vein mapping, DVT, Renal, AAA, Venous insufficiency, AVF Eval. Some pediatric vascular.
For echo/vascular: Is lab accredited? Specifically, in what?	Yes - Peripheral venous, Peripheral Arterial, Cerebrovascular and Visceral vascular
Parking tips	Park in parking garage 10- next to the Pediatric ER (off Newell Drive). Parking costs \$4/day with parking voucher daily (get from Matt Echo/Vasc Lab Supervisor) without the voucher parking costs \$10/day. Second option is a \$35 monthly parking decal but you can only park in certain areas – this can be obtained from UF Transportation Services. Also, you could take a bus which is free with SFC ID.
How do you find the lab after parking?	Leave the parking garage and cross Archer Road at the light (the street is Newell going back toward the parking garage and Circle of Hope Dr on the other side. After crossing archer, follow the signs for the Heart/Vascular Building. Enter the Heart & Vascular Hospital through the main entrance by the valet stand. You will see the Opus coffee shop. The coffee shop is next to the entrance to the Heart/Vascular lobby. The vascular lab entrance is all the way to the back on the right.
Cafeteria and other food tips	Break room with frig/microwave if you bring your own lunch. There is a coffee shop/cafe in the main lobby and a cafeteria on the 3rd floor. The cafeteria has 2-4 stations such as greek food, American food, salad, and other choices. Other towers have additional food options.
What is the dress code for students in the lab?	Any solid color scrubs. Be sure to wear nurse's clogs or tennis shoes. Must wear your SFC student badge.
